

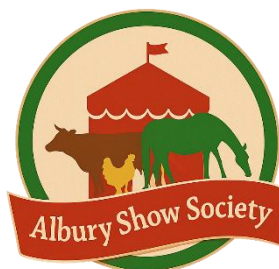

Entry Instructions

Entries for the Albury Show must be completed online via ShowdayOnline (with exceptions listed below). **Please follow the steps below to submit your entries:**

1. Visit **ShowdayOnline** via the website: <https://www.showdayonline.com>
2. Create an account or log in with your existing details.
3. Search for **"Albury Show"** and select the relevant competition section.
4. Carefully read all class information, conditions, and requirements before entering.
5. Select your classes and complete the entry details for each exhibit/competitor.
6. Proceed to checkout and complete payment online using the secure payment system.
7. You will receive a confirmation email once your entries have been successfully submitted.

Entry fees and closing dates are listed within each section on ShowdayOnline.

PROTESTS & PROCEDURES

1. Lodging a Verbal Protest: Verbal protests must be lodged with the relevant Ringmaster, Chief Steward, or Section Coordinator within 10 minutes of judging of the relevant exhibit or exhibitor (or within 24 hours for non-ring sections such as Arts). The nature of the complaint must be clearly stated. The official may take immediate action to ensure fairness or refer the matter to the Protests Committee.
2. Protests Committee: The Protests Committee will consist of the President (or Vice President) and two Committee members.
3. Written Protests, Complaints, or Appeals: If the matter is unresolved or an appeal is required, a written protest must be lodged with the Secretary on the day of judging:
 - o Ring sections (e.g. Horses, Cattle): by 10:00 pm on the day of judging
 - o Non-ring sections (e.g. Arts): within 12 hours of the initial decision/response

All written protests must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit (or \$100 for Arts-type sections where specified), which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous or vexatious.

4. Determination of Protests

The Protests Committee (or Executive Committee where applicable) will determine the matter within 24 hours, and its decision is final.

5. Limitations on Protests

- o Protests relating solely to a judge's decision will not be considered.
- o The Show Society reserves the right to determine eligibility of entries, and its decision is final.

6. Conduct Requirements

- o Exhibitors and their associates must not communicate with judges before, during, or after judging except through official channels.
- o Any exhibitor or associate behaving in an offensive or improper manner may be removed from the grounds and may be refused future entry.

FEES

- Online entries: \$5 per class. On-the-day entries: \$10 per class, 8:00–8:45am only
- Vehicle entry: \$15 driver included; \$5 per passenger. Via Fallon Street gate F2 on map.

CONDITIONS

- Riders/exhibitors must register before entering any arena.
- All fees, prizes, trophies, ribbons and sashes include GST. Prize money is available from horse stewards after each class. Judges may withhold prizes; their decision is final.
- The Committee may amend the schedule.
- Competitors must be ready when called. Judging will not be delayed for late entries.
- The Society will take all reasonable care but accepts no responsibility for loss, injury, or damage.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. The Committee may refuse any entry without stating a reason.
- Stallions may not be ridden in classes unless specifically permitted. All stallions must be paraded with a bit. Stallion handlers and riders must be 17 years or older.
- Stewards may request registration papers, membership proof, height cards, and may order measuring and/or drug testing.
- Exhibitors and associates must not speak to judges on judging day—before, during, or after judging.
- Offensive behaviour on the showground will result in removal and possible refusal of re-admission.
- Drug testing may occur. Breaches of ASC Disputes & Disciplinary Regulations will be referred to the ASC Disciplinary Committee (see www.agshowsnsw.org.au).
- Any act of cruelty or abuse toward people or animals will be dealt with by the Protest Committee.
- Horse competitors must sign indemnity and waiver forms and list all horses brought onto the grounds, including the property PIC.

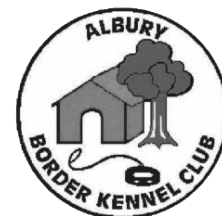

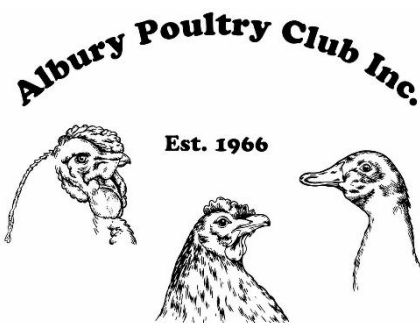

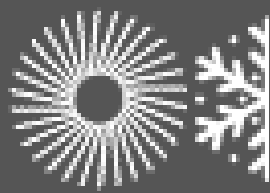

-The winning local exhibit may progress to Group Final, and the Group winner may progress to State Final. An exhibit may represent only one Society and one Group, and items previously shown at Group level are not eligible. -If the class is not scheduled or has no entries, the Chief Pavilion Steward, with judges and exhibitor permission, may select three suitable exhibits to represent the Society.

The competition is conducted in three stages:

1. Local competitions are held at affiliated Agricultural Shows. Winners receive the specified prize and may progress to the Group Final.
2. Group Finals are held in the 14 AgShows NSW regional groups, where eligible local winners bake a second Rich Fruit Cake. Winners progress to the State Final. If there is only one eligible entrant in a group, they proceed automatically.
3. The NSW State Final is held annually at the Sydney Royal Easter Show. Group finalists bake a third Rich Fruit Cake, with winners receiving the specified prize and AgShows NSW Plaque.

INGREDIENTS:

- 250g sultanas
- 250 g chopped raisins
- 250 g currants
- 125 g chopped mixed peel
- 90 g chopped red glace cherries
- 90 g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250 g plain flour
- 60 g self-raising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs.

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
2. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
3. Sift together the flours and spices
4. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
5. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures.
6. Mix thoroughly.
7. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
8. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours.
9. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

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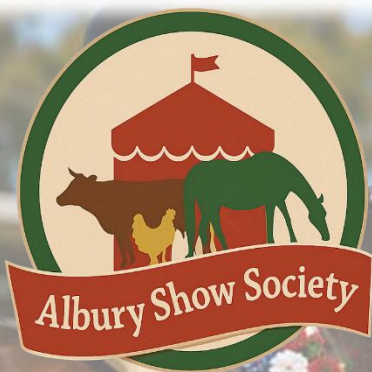
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
