Welcome to the Arts & Crafts Section of the 2025 Albury Show

The Arts and Crafts Pavilion is a place to show off your creativity and to admire the works of our community members.

We encourage you to enter your creations into our show and become a part of our event and support the Albury Show's Arts & Craft Pavilion!

The Albury Show Society Committee wishes to thank our Stewards & Judges who volunteer their time and provide valuable assistance in making the Arts & Craft Pavilion a wonderful place to exhibit and visit.

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ARTS & CRAFTS REGULATIONS

The Society reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not comply with regulations. The regulations are not negotiable.

1. Entry fee \$2 (unless otherwise stated). Entry fees include GST and are non-refundable.
2. Entries (i.e. entry forms & entry monies) must be received at the office of the Show Society (or by direct deposit. See entry form) by Friday October 24th. No late entries will be accepted.
3. Please see the website, for office hours. Volunteers will be available at the J.J. Wright Pavilion, Friday 24th October 9-11m, to receive entry forms etc.
4. All entries must have been completed in the last 18 months and not previously entered In an Albury Show.
5. A novice exhibitor is one who has not won a first prize at an Albury Annual Show.
6. Laundered articles or worn articles are not eligible for entry.
7. Machine made articles must not have any handwork, unless otherwise stated.
8. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason thereto.
9. All exhibits must have tickets firmly attached: eg, safety pins, sewn, tape, (dressmakers pins not permitted).
10. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property, and homemade work of the exhibitor.
11. Each exhibit is eligible to be entered in one class only.
12. Stewards reserve the right to put wrongly entered exhibits into the correct classes.
13. The coordinator reserves the right to cancel, change, create or combine classes according to the number of entries received.
14. **Judging in the J.J. Wright Pavilion will commence on Friday 31st October at 11am promptly. No spectators will be permitted in the judging area. No Exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging.**
15. The judge may withhold a prize, or only award a 2nd, if the exhibit is not up to standard. The The judge's decision is final.
16. Whilst all due care will be taken by the Societies committee, stewards and representatives. No responsibility will be incurred by the society.

ARTS AND CRAFT REGULATIONS continued:

17. Points awarded in each section: 1st- 5 points, 2nd- 3 points.
18. **Prize money will be available for collection Monday 3rd November, 2025. In the J.J. Wright Pavilion, 9-11am**, on presentation of prize vouchers. Prize money not collected by Friday 8th November 2025, will be refunded to the Show Society. Note- all perpetual trophies will remain in the Albury Show Society Office, on the Albury ShowGround.
19. Entry forms to be by email, mail or in person, * entries cannot be accepted over the phone.
20. The Show Society will be the sole arbiter on any question of the eligibility of an entry.
21. Any exhibitor or associate who behaves offensively on the Showgrounds will be removed from the ground and may be refused future admission.
22. Any protest or question about a competition result must be directed to the Co-ordinator of the section within 24 hours of judging. If the exhibitor is not satisfied with the answer or decision, he or she may lodge a formal protest with the Show Secretary within 12 hours of the chief steward's response. This formal protest will be dealt with by the Show Society's Executive Committee which will give a final decision within 24 hours.

Details of the protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.

DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason for **DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS**

Please adhere strictly to delivery times as stated in the schedule. Exhibits delivered after the delivery time, will not be staged or judged.

2. **All exhibits must have entry tickets attached before delivery to the nominated pavilion, building or office.**
3. The J.J. Wright pavilion is located on the East of Hague Avenue (off Fallon Street).
4. The committee will give every possible facility to exhibitors and every care will be taken with the exhibits. But NO responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
5. Exhibits shall NOT be removed before **3pm Saturday 1st November 2025**, except as the coordinator may direct.
6. Competitors taking part in any show competition, do so at their own risk.
7. *** Please note, that when delivering exhibits to The JJ Wright Pavilion, that no admittance, beyond the entrance is permitted, due to set up requirements. Thank you for your understanding.**
8. *Please remain courteous with all Arts and Crafts Stewards, as they volunteer their time, across the Show weekend. Absolutely no aggressive behaviours will be tolerated, and those that become aggressive, will be asked to leave and reported to security.

9. *All work to have been completed in the eighteen (18) months prior to its entry at A local show.*
10. *An exhibit that has previously completed at Group level is not eligible to Compete again.*
11. *If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select suitable quilt and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.*
12. *Group Final location and date is to be determined by the Group. It is the responsibility of either the exhibitor or the Show Society to ensure the quilt is delivered on Judging Day and collected in an appropriate time frame after the competition.*

WOOLLEN ARTICLES/GARMENTS

STATE COMPETITION.

Competition to be conducted at Society, Group & State Level.

CLASS: THREE (3) DIFFERENT TYPES WOOL ARTICLES AND/OR GARMENTS CONDITIONS:

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a) **Garment:** an item that can be worn e.g. Dress, jacket, scarf, hat.
 - b) **Article:** a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket: without an outfit, e.g. bag: for amusement, e.g. toy: as a decoration. picture etc.
 - c) **Three Different Types:** the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg. 1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg. 2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or quilted tea cosy OR eg. 3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
2. The **whole** article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of **80% SHEEP wool**.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and Must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
4. **A sample of yarn, fabric or fibre with a label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit.** If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.'
5. An exhibit in the competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
6. All three articles/garments must have been made within twelve months of the local Show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a Local Show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State Level.
9. An exhibitor (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to coordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
12. **Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable)**

Conditions of Entry.

1. Each and every photograph must be the work of the exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of 10 entries in each class.
3. Entries to be mounted on foam board or cardboard.
4. Entries are to be identified in the top left-hand corner on the back, with the class, Title, and name. (e.g. P1. Title. and Name).
5. Preferred maximum entry size is 50 x 40cm
6. Preferred minimum entry size in 10 x 15cm.
7. All sizes in between are welcome.
8. Monochrome (Black and White) prints- may have one overall tone, eg. sepia
9. Computer generated or digitally enhanced are now acceptable (must be labelled)
10. Junior entrants may enter any or all above categories.
11. All entries must have been created within the past 18 months and be the sole work of the entrant.
12. Organisers reserve the right to reject any entries, including work that does not conform to all conditions of entry, alongside late entries.
13. Whilst every care will be taken by organisers and show representatives, no responsibility will be incurred for loss of damage to entries. This year's theme, if you choose to, is 'Water', meaning any photography taken in or around water. If you choose to include your work within this theme, please include it within your description on the back. The winning photo will be featured in our 2024 edition of the Albury Show Schedule, alongside your name.

Bottles and Jars -

375gram jars preferred for jams, jellies and chutneys. All jar lids to be clean and free of any manufacturer's labels, but clearly indicating contents. Lids with lid covers accepted as lid being 'label free'. No paraffin wax to be left on bottles or jars.

To comply with health regulations, cellophane covers will not be accepted. Please remove all cellophane covers and replace them with lids prior to delivering exhibits to the showground.

Marmalade- Rind must be clear, bright & light.

4. No late entries will be accepted
5. All entries must be homemade and home baked. No commercial packet mixture.
6. Must be presented in oven bags (i.e. not in glad wrap, plastic or freezer bags).
7. All entries to be placed on foil covered hard base (i.e. not plates) to suit baking.
8. **Junior Cooking** is for entrants 13 years and under and on disposable plastic plates of appropriate size and presented in oven bags.

THE ASC OF NSW – RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

INGREDIENTS:

250gr (8oz) Sultanas
250gr (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar
1/2 teas. Grated Nutmeg
1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy
250gr (8oz) Currants
4 large eggs
1/2 teas. Ground Cloves
250gr (8 oz) Plain Flour
125gr (4 oz) Chopped Mixed Peel
1/2 teas. Vanilla Essence
1/2 teas. Ground Ginger
60gr (2 oz) Self Raising Flour
90gr (3oz) Chopped Red Glazed Cherries
250gr (8oz) chopped Raisins
250gr (8oz) Butter
1/2 teas. Almond Essence
90gr (3oz) Chopped Blanched Almonds
1/2 teas. Lemon Essence OR finely grated lemon rind

METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the Sherry or Brandy. Cover mixture and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together butter and sugar with essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20cm x 20cm (8"x 8") tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Judge Note: The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

Winner to compete at Group Zone Final, and if placed, will compete at the Royal Easter Show.
